Son allegedly kills mother, buries her under couch

OR almost a month, pensioner Cecilia Ntelele's body lay inside the shallow grave dug beneath the shack she shared with her son, in Finetown.

Her unemployed 46-year-old son, Molefi, roomed shack the two had shared for years.

pretended that nothing had happened, and continued eating and sleeping inside the two-

But on Sunday afternoon, Molefi was in police custody, and Ntelele's body had been exhumed and taken to the morgue, leaving behind a stifling smell that would remind relatives and neighbours of their gruesome discovery.

On Sunday, February 19, family members and residents could not contain their emotions after the body of 72-year-old Ntelele was discovered. She was reported missing on January 21.

It is alleged that the accused told relatives that his mother was taken to Bloemfontein by an uncle, whose name was not known to family members.

A neighbour, said Molefi's behaviour grew strange after his mother went missing.

Rapoo and other members of the family, said that all Ntelele's essentials, such as her crutches and medication, were still in the

Police were alerted and Molefi was arrested.

Schools under siege

ALABOTJHA Secondary School in Vlakfontein, New Generation Combined School in Univille in Lenasia South and Willowmead Secondary School also in Lenasia South, fell victim to crime during the past week.

One of the robberies occurred on Wednesday, February 15, in the early hours at Qalabotjha Secondary School in Vlakfontein.

It is alleged that at around 1.10am two community patrollers aged 23 and 42, noticed that unknown people were unlawfully on the school premises.

When they went to investigate they were confronted by five unknown men, one of which was armed with a firearm.

The patrollers were then held at gunpoint and had their hands and legs bound with shoelaces.

"The suspects forced open the door of the tuckshop and stole groceries," said Lenasia SAPS spokesperson, Sergeant Khalipha Mvula.

The suspects then fled the scene by jumping over the perimeter fence and disappeared into the darkness.

The victims were left unharmed and were able to free themselves after the suspects had left the scene.

A case of business robbery is being investigated.

New Generation Combined School robbery

In another incident, the New Generation Combined School was also targeted. In this incident, six unknown armed suspects held up a 42-year-old patroller.

The man's arms and legs were bound with shoelaces and his cell phone was stolen.

"They then proceeded to break open the school's offices and stole an Acer computer,

circuit breakers, gardening tools, and an undisclosed amount of cash from the school principal's office," Mvula said.

The men then fled the scene on foot.

Willowmead Secondary School robbery

In yet another incident, Willowmead Secondary School, was also a target.

Community patrollers had been on night duty at the school when, they too, were attacked by six suspects. In this robbery too, one of the suspects was armed with a firearm.

The robbery took place in the early hours of Sunday, February 12.

The suspects allegedly demanded the keys to the computer room from the patrollers before searching them and taking a cell phone and a pair of takkies from one of the patrollers.

"A swift response by a local security company reaction team led to the suspects fleeing the scene before they could proceed and break into the computer room," Mvula said. A case of armed robbery was opened and police investigations are underway.

"As police, we are making a humble plea to the members of the public to come forward with information that could lead to the successful arrest of these suspects. Community members should call our sector patrol van numbers or the crime stop number, 08600 10111," said the SAPS.

Soweto West Cluster weekend success

THE Soweto West Cluster, which consists of Ennerdale, Dobsonville, Jabulane, Lenasia, Lenasia South, Moroka, Naledi and Jabulane SAPS made 152 arrests on Saturday, February 11 and Sunday, February 12.

The successes were a result of intelligence driven operations that were conducted throughout the cluster. They included special operations which are aimed at addressing drug-related crimes, intensified stop and search, foot patrols as well as tracing wanted suspects.

The successes were achieved as a result of the close working relationship with other law enforcement agencies such as the Johannesburg Metro Police Department.

The suspects were arrested for various offences.

Among those arrested was a 45-year-old suspect who was charged with murder and attempted murder. The arrest follows an incident that occurred on Friday, February 10, at around 6.30am, in Soweto. Two rival taxi associations fighting over routes exchanged gunfire resulting in three people being injured. One of the injured later died in hospital.

The suspects appeared at various Magistrates' Courts on Monday, February 13.





Man killed in Zak Park hijacking

OLICE have launched a manhunt for two hijackers who shot and killed a 36-year-old Zakariyya Park man in a hijacking in Peppercorn Street on Wednesday, February 15. According to Lenasia South SAPS spokesperson, Sergeant Khalipha Mvula, two men accosted the victim who had been entering his driveway at around 10.50pm on the day in question.

"The unknown suspects started opening fire on the victim while he was still inside his vehicle," Mvula said.

In an attempt to flee to safety, the victim allegedly alighted from his vehicle. However, he was shot several times, before he collapsed next to his vehicle.

The suspects are then alleged to have fled the

The car was then abandoned a few houses away and the suspects fled on foot. The victim was certified dead at the scene by paramedics.

"Police are appealing to the members of the public who witnessed this brutal killing or who might have information on the whereabouts of the suspects to come forward with the information by calling the crime stop number on 08600 10111 or contacting their local po-

lice station."

"...we'll leave no stone unturned until the culprits are arrested and brought to book and face the full might of the law," Myula added.

A case of murder and carjacking is being investigated.

"We as police also encourage members of the public to report crime anonymously by sending an sms with full details to the Crime Line on 32211," Myula said.

Alleged drunk driver crashes into storeroom, police a no-show

A storeroom, belonging to Lenasia South resident, Wilson Simelane, and a neighbouring wall were recently damaged when a vehicle crashed into it.

According to Simelane, he and his sons were watching TV at his home on the corner of Sheffield and Balken streets, when they heard a loud bang. When they went outside to investigate, they saw a crashed car, with three occupants inside and witnessed the driver making a run for it into a nearby veld. It later emerged that the car belonged to one of the occupants.

According to Simelane, the occupants of the car had been intoxicated, which brings the question to mind, could the driver also have been under the influence of alcohol? To make matters worse, the police

To make matters worse, the police were called after the incident, but they never arrived.

"I called the police station at around 9.50pm, 20 minutes after the incident," he said.

It is alleged the father of the car owner also arrived on the scene and



promised to pay for the damage caused to Simelane' storeroom and his neighbour's wall. Two of the passengers in the car were rushed to hospital. Simelane and the driver's father then headed to the police station.

"When we got to the police station, the officer on duty refused to open a case, but took affidavits that were stamped," Simelane said.

Spokesperson of the Lenasia South SAPS, sergeant Khalipha Mvula ad-

vised Simelane to visit the station and lay a complaint if he is not happy with the service he received.

Speed humps

According to Simelane, this had not been the first time such an incident has taken place.

"There are always accidents at the stop street near my house mainly because the street signs are ignored," he

He asked if someone needed to die

before speed humps are put up on the road. Simelane says he has approached the local councillor about the situation.

"I fetched him from his office and brought him here, just so he could witness the unlawfulness of drivers at the stop street," he said.

Councillor for the area, Vinay Choonie told the Rising Sun that he is aware of the problem and that a signed petition had been handed over to the Johannesburg Roads Agency (JRA).

"That stop street is not the only problematic area, there are several others and we are aware of them. We have already referred the problem to the JRA," Choonie said.

He said such problems were inherited from the previous administration.

administration.

"The city cannot fix things overnight, it is up to the JRA," he said.

He, however, said that he had been engaging with JMPD for more visibility in the area.



Shiraaz may return home soon

CCORDING to Truth Collective South Africa, a Cape Town based NGO, kidnapped photojournalist, Shiraaz Mohamed is alive.

The NGO told Jacaranda news that they had seen proof in the form of photos and videos.

This came after the group flew to Syria, 12 days ago in a bid to facilitate Mohamed's release.

Bakar al Maharmeh from the Truth Collective South Africa, said he made contact with a mediator between the rebel groups and the Syrian government and it was established that Mohamed was alive and being held by Jabhat al-Nusra in Idlib.

Al Maharmeh said that with the assistance of the South African and Syrian governments, as well as the South African ambassador there, they are busy facilitating his release.

Al Maharmeh says through the mediator they have established that Jabhat al-Nusra was offering to trade Mohamed for the release of four of their members held by the Syrian government.

Despite the crimes committed by these four men, the Syrian govern-



ment has agreed to the negotiations in order to maintain a good relationship between Syria and South Africa.

According to al Maharmeh, the infighting between the different rebel groups there has been some delay in securing Shiraaz's release, but if there is any window of opportunity, they will bring him home - he is sure it will be before the end of the month.

Al-Maharmeh will depart for Syria next month to secure Mohamed's release.

Mohamed was kidnapped on January 10 by Syrian rebels.

Mohamed arrived in Syria on January 4, after planning the trip for months. He had taken a number of photographs inside and around the Gift of the Givers hospitals.

He was meant to have left the country on the day he was kidnapped travelling to the Turkish border.

On January 9, Mohamed texted his family to say that there was a chance he might be detained before leaving the country.

At the time of his kidnapping his family said they were "devastated at the news of his disappearance'.

VOE FM shut down

THE newly established radio station, Voice of Ennerdale (VOE), was shut down after a week in operation.

It was discovered that they did not have proper documents.

The radio station (100.8 FM) operated in Lenasia, Migson Manor, Finetown, and Lawley Station.

The VOE staff was described by its owner, Moketi Mokoena, as amateurish.

According to a source, the radio station operated from a

back yard in Ennerdale, and the device used to obtain the frequency and broadcast was unlicensed.

"The radio station caused frequency interference with anoth-

er radio station," said the source.

Mokoena confirmed the shut down. He said the station was not licensed because the device they used to broadcast did not need the station to be licensed with ICASA.

"ICASA came and shut us down, but we are currently in the process of registering," said Mokoena.


Level 1 District Hospital, taxi rank on the cards for Lenasia South

The school was founded by Bassiouni in 1992. Bassiouni was detained when he entered Egypt with his family to attend his daughter's


engagement in 2014. On arrival at Cairo International Airport, he and his son Bilal were taken into custody.

Bilal was released 20 hours later. However, Bassiouni, who holds dual Egyptian and South African citizenship and who has lived in South Africa for 25 years, had a far longer wait for freedom.

Making veggie days happy days

Sundried Tomatoes, Basil and Paneer Sausages... serve with a Capsicum Relish on Rye bread

This recipe is among my favourite foodie creations. The beautiful flavour that the sundried tomatoes bring to this dish, along with the fresh basil, is just the perfect unisons of flavour combinations and the very best of cross cultural fusion. "Dedicated To Making Veggie Day Happy Days'

25 min-Preparation Time: utes Cooking time, 30 minutes Makes 15-18

Ingredients Paneer Sausages Paneer freshly made with 2 li-

tres milk 10 sundried tomatoes soaked in

boiling water for 10 minutes or until soft 1/4 cup fresh basil leaves finely

sliced

1 tsp (5ml) salt

1 tbsp (15ml) besan flour (chana flour) 1 tbsp (15ml) cold water

Oil vegetable for deep frying This is how:

Crumble paneer in a bowl. To this add the chopped tomatoes, finely chopped basil leaves, salt, besan flour, and water. Now use your hands and mix all the ingredients. The mixture should be slightly sticky, just enough to hold its shape when pressed into a ball. With your hands, form small balls and then lightly press them into an elongated shape about 5 cm long, still rolling them between your palms to create a nice smooth finish.

As soon as all the mixture had been shaped. Heat oil in a small heavy based pot. Once the oil is hot reduce the heat and allow the oil to cool down too low to medium heat.

Gently add a few sausages to heated oil and fry for a 1 ½ or 2 minutes. As soon as they cooked they will being to float. Make sure that the oil in not too hot or too cold. Once done, drain on a kitchen towel

Serve them some capsicum relish on Rye bread

Alternatively, you can roll them into balls and add to curries and chutneys of your choice. (Check out my second recipe. Instead of sausage shapes - I made small balls and a delish coconut gravy)

Capsicum Relish (also known as peppers)

1 tbsp (15ml) olive oil

1 cup (250ml) onion finely sliced

1 large green capsicum finely sliced

2 large cloves garlic finely chopped

1 tsp salt (adjust accordingly)

1 green chillies finely sliced (add more or less)

This is how:

heat oil in a pot. Add onions and cook until they just begin to brown. Toss in capsicum, garlic and chilli - give it a good stir. Reduce heat and cook until peppers are soft and onions are beautifully caramelised 10 - 12 minutes. (You may add 2 tablespoons water to aid cooking)

1 loaf Rye bread sliced

spread a generous amount of relish on a slice of rye bread with 2 Sundried Tomatoes, Basil & Paneer Sausages (add more or less according to the size of the bread) Recipe by Videhi

Finally, Nisaa also offers children at the shelter, who are not of school going age, developmental, stimulating and educational programmes to ensure healthy growth and development.

It costs Nisaa R5 000 a month to carry out the services mentioned above for one client. Nisaa is able to accommodate 22 people. In this regard, costs can escalate to R110 000 a month. They understand that this is an exorbitant amount in these trying financial times. Any contribution to the centre will be greatly appreciated.



Chicken dumping: What you should know

HICKEN dumping is becoming a national crisis. Between 4 000 and 5 000 jobs in the industry have been lost, and 110 000 more are at risk, plus 20 000 in the feed supply sector.

Chicken Dumping will destroy the SA chicken industry, not because the industry cannot compete, but because it is being killed by dumping, a practice which has been outlawed by the World Trade Organisation (WTO).

What is chicken dumping?

Other countries are dumping large quantities of surplus chicken in the South African market at prices that are far below their production

So why is this a problem?

Because thousands of jobs have already been lost in a country with one of the highest unemployment rates in the world.

In reality this affects many more people as each worker may support as many as 10 people.

The South African Poultry Association

(Sapa) warned four years ago, that 20 000 jobs could be lost if imports of cheap chicken continued.

Since then the volume of dumped chicken has increased.

Warning: The entire South African chicken industry may collapse before the end of

RCL Foods, one of SA's largest chicken producers, has warned that the dumping could cause the entire South African chicken industry to collapse before the end of 2017.

Last month RCL laid off 1 350 employees 20 percent of its workforce – and is selling 15 of its 25 farms.

Why is there a chicken surplus in some countries?

Chicken breasts and wings are currently the preferred parts of the chicken in North America and Europe. These so called "premium cuts" can be sold there at a price high enough to cover the production cost of the entire chicken. The drumsticks and thighs, which are

classified as waste, are then sold below cost to SA, undermining local producers. In fact they are sold in any market that will take them for any price the exporters can get.

Dumping is against the rules of the WTO

Selling below the cost of production is the trade definition of dumping and against the rules of the WTO.

As local producers cannot compete with dumped chicken at artificially low prices, they are left with no option but to cut jobs and close

SA one of few countries allowing dumping

SA is targeted by exporters, particularly those in Europe and South America because it is one of the few countries that allows virtually unrestricted chicken imports.

Russia closed its doors to EU imports in 2014 and China raised tariffs and health barriers to restrict imports.

As African countries were targeted, many implemented measures to protect their local industries. In Ghana the local chicken industry

has collapsed as they did not implement protective measures.

This is not about SA's inefficiency

SA's chicken industry is the fifth most efficient in the world, with production costs well below those in Europe.

SA chicken exports blocked

Many countries block SA exports for a variety of reasons.

South American countries say our abattoirs are not good enough. To have our abattoirs approved is a lengthy process which will require years of certification.

The US and Europe use ostriches with bird flu as an excuse to block SA exports even though our chicken industry has never had avian flu.

SA needs to act quickly and implement the measures demanded by other countries if the country's chicken industry is to survive. These include phytosanitary measures, health checks and abattoir certification.

5 good reasons why you should eat more beetroot

BEETS are a powerhouse of nutrients that may improve your health in a variety of ways.

Lowers blood pressure

New plastic eating devices bring hope for saving the ocean

MORE than five trillion pieces of plastic currently litter our oceans, strangling them to death. But these new inventions may be the answer.

22-year-old Boyan Slat and his Ocean Cleanup Foundation

The level of plastic in the oceans is an increasingly urgent issue.

Getting rid of the plastic is the aim of The Ocean Cleanup Foundation, a Dutch company founded by 22-year-old inventor Boyan Slat, when he was 17.

Advanced clean-up system is being tested in the North Sea

Slat created a prototype of an advanced clean-up system consisting of a 100 meter-long barrier segment which has been installed in the North Sea, 23 km off the coast of The Netherlands where it will remain for one year.

The long, floating barrier acts as an artificial coastline, passively catching and concentrating ocean debris, powered by the ocean's natural currents. Because the barriers are at the surface of the ocean, they will be subjected to the most extreme conditions. It is of paramount importance that the barriers are tested in those conditions.

Hopefully deployed in the Great Pacific Garbage Patch

The prototype will show how the

Ocean Cleanup floating barrier fares in extreme weather at sea – the kind of conditions the system will eventually face when deployed in the Great Pacific Garbage Patch.

This prototype is the first ocean clean-up system to be tested at sea.


Slat says a successful outcome of the tests should see the first operational pilot system deployed in late 2017. He adds that the Ocean Cleanup Foundation's system is one of the world's most promising for cleaning up ac-

A water drone that eats plastic

While the Ocean Cleanup team is trying to filter the smallest particles of plastic out of the ocean, in the port of Rotterdam a drone able to collect up to 500 kg of trash, called the Waste Shark, has been deployed.

The Waste Shark is a water drone, about the size of a passenger car. The plastic waste that it gobbles up is recycled.





Medicinal Marijuana now a reality in SA

THE government has given the green light for the manufacture of cannabis for medicinal use – with the IFP hailing it a "major victory" and tribute to its late MP, Mario Oriani-Ambrosini who fought for the legalisation of the drug.

IFP MP Narend Singh said a letter sent to him by the Medical Control Council's working group on cannabis – indicated it would publish its proposed guidelines on cannabis production for medicinal use following its presentation to the council last week.

The current framework allows

for use of cannabis for medicinal purposes, but under strict regulations which include requesting permission from the Medical Control Council for use in certain exceptional circumstances by registered medical practitioners. Patients may also only use it under supervision.

Cannabis oil use has fanned international debate in medical circles, with advocates of medicinal cannabis claiming its effectiveness in pain management and treatment of diseases including cancer, glaucoma, multiple sclerosis and epilepsy.



Don't promise what you cannot deliver

NO two words can invoke as much hope and confidence as "I promise". As children we are taught that promises are pledges which cannot be broken under any circumstances.

But as we mature the old saying "promises were meant to be broken", becomes a reality. Sometimes we forget that a promise is like a pledge or a vow and it should be made only if we are absolutely sure that we can fulfil it.

As Muslims, our word should be our bond, and if we make promises, then we should also make sure that we keep them, for Allah says, "surely every promise shall be questioned about". (17;39)

Let us not forget that even though we are neglectful, our two angels are not. If someone asks a favour of you, and you say yes, just because you said Insh-Allah, does not give you permission to break that verbal agreement. So many of us use Insh-Allah, as a way to get out of verbal agreements we have with each other. Many of us use Insh-Allah to say yes when in our hearts we actually mean no.

As Muslims we are honour-bound to be truthful with each other, and we should always say what we mean, and mean what we say. How many times have we heard couples who have just married talk of the promises they have made to each other?

She promised that she will always look her best when he is at home, that the house will be in immaculate at all times and that she will be the model of obedience.

He promises that he will help maintain their home, help her with the children and that he will practically remain "the groom that sweeps clean". Six to eight months later, we find a much different picture. We often find neither of them living up to the promises they made, and this is actually the cause of much conflict and tension in many new marriages.

We must be careful to guard the promises we make to each other for Allah says, "Whoever fulfils his promise guards (against evil)." (3;76). Broken promises in a marital relationship can lead to many problems.

When promises are broken, it breaks down the fragile walls of trust and confidence that must be maintained in order for the relationship to flourish.

What may seem like a little thing to you may be something quite big to someone else. By guarding our promises, we also guard the integrity or our relationship. This in turn, displays a more secure sense of reliability, trust and confidence.

To no other group of individuals are broken

promises more devastating, than to children. Children are like elephants, they almost never forget. If you promise a child something, they will remember that promise, even though they may not say it to you.

When a child finds out that you are not a person of your word it could leave numerous hidden scars that could lead to a number of behavioural and disciplinary problems.

By keeping our promises to our children, we are also showing them the importance of honour and commitment. As parents we must always remember the old saying, "Do as I say, not as I do" does not work. Let us be always mindful of the vows and promises we make to each other, so that through them we can tighten the bonds that hold us together.

N February 7, the Lenasia Muslim School was offered the opportunity to visit a maximum detention centre near Denysville. The visit allowed them to witness the multi-cultural and multi-linguistic dynamics of our country and the importance we need to give to our rainbow nation. Furthermore, they learnt that one should not judge a person because of any wrongdoings since

that individual may be remorseful and show repentance. If Allah (SWT) can forgive our shortcomings then so should we.

Students met with former Bafana Bafana players who were also doing their civic duty by visiting the facility. They were impressed by these famous sportsmen who contributed their time and effort to uplift others by being good role-models.

Finally, the most important highlight was the realization how faith, and Muslims in particular, can impact on self-reformation and rehabilitation of the very dangerous, within the closed confines of society. We hope that this trip instills good behavior, responsibility and serves as an eye-opener to our children. We are certain that they will relate to, and impress upon their peers the dangers of drugs and gangsterism.

LMS will carry on embarking on social upliftment programmes to teach its students their civic duty and responsibility in society by taking education outside of the classroom and curriculum.





The club had an extremely successful 2016 season and are planning for more of the same in 2017.






Hollywood supports local sport...
